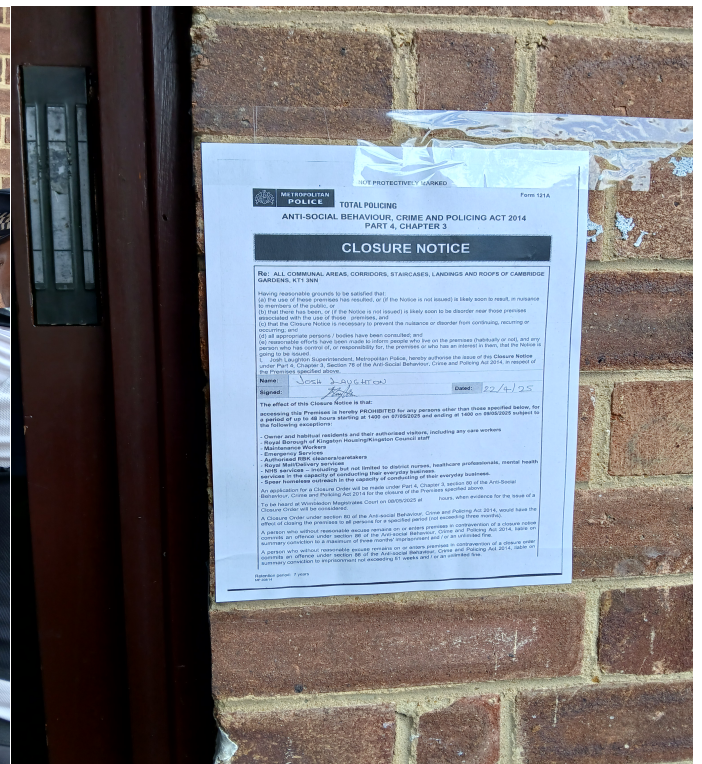

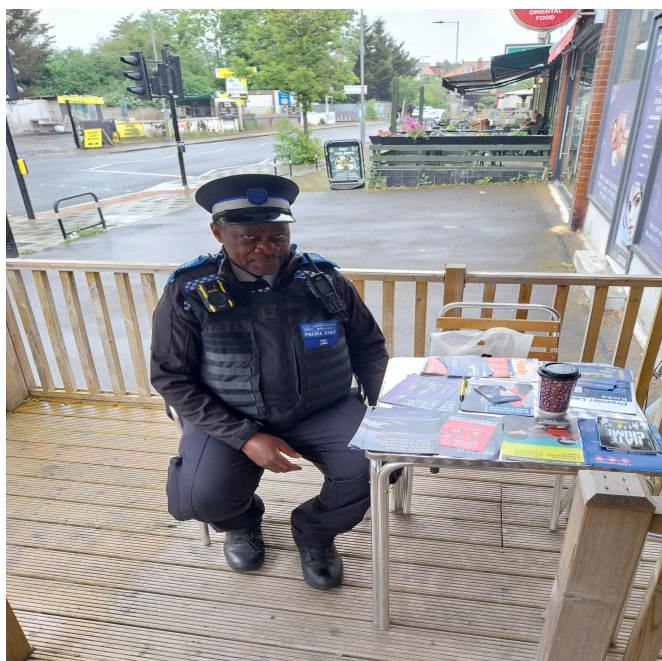




Cambridge Gardens Closure Order

Housing Surgery Meeting

PCSO JJINGO attended the Housing Surgery meeting at the Queen Mary Hall Cambridge Gardens on Thursday 15th May together with Kingston Council housing officers. We talked about ways to stop trespassers accessing empty properties on the Cambridge Estate, preventing fly tipping and ASB Nuisance on both Estates and the closure order in place at the Cambridge Gardens and meeting and addressing concerns of the residents in attendance. All entrances to the Cambridge Estate have notices of the closure order to be in place for three months from the 8th May 2025.

Street a Week, We continue to conduct a 'street-a week' initiative, conducting a door to door campaign where Residents are introduced to and asked to sign up to the MET ENGAGE Platform. It is a brand new platform through which you will receive updates from your local police officers on issues that matter most to you. Services will be tailored to the community needs.
