

North Richmond NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH BRIEFING for NOVEMBER 2025

There were 10 crimes of note for Neighbourhood Watch in November.

BUSINESS BURGLARY

- 6th November - PREMIER INN, LOWER MORTLAKE ROAD – Attempted Burglary
- 23rd November – KEW ROAD – Shop broken into, money stolen from till.

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

- 9th November – CASTLEGATE - Burglary of Garden House, door broken and items stolen from within.

THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE

- 5th November - LOWER MORTLAKE ROAD – Childrens bikes stolen from vehicle.
- 8th November - RALEIGH ROAD – Registration plate stole
- 17th November – CLYDESDALE GARDENS – Secured, locked vehicle broken into, items stolen from within as well as Registration Plate
- 21st November – RALEIGH ROAD – Car broken into, property stolen.
- 28th November – MANOR GROVE – Tools stolen from vehicle.

THEFT OF BICYCLE

- 5th November – Sheen Road - Bicycle stolen from secure garden.

THEFT OF PARCEL

- 14th November – CARLTON ROAD – items stolen from within parcel whilst in transit

General messages on Theft from and of vehicles is not leave valuable items in an unattended vehicle especially never leave bags on display as thieves will enter a vehicle hoping they contain something valuable.

It is important to double check if cars are left locked and secure as well as making sure there is sufficient lighting around the vehicles at night as well as making sure that keyless vehicles have keys left far away from the vehicle or even better placed in a key signal blocking device.
