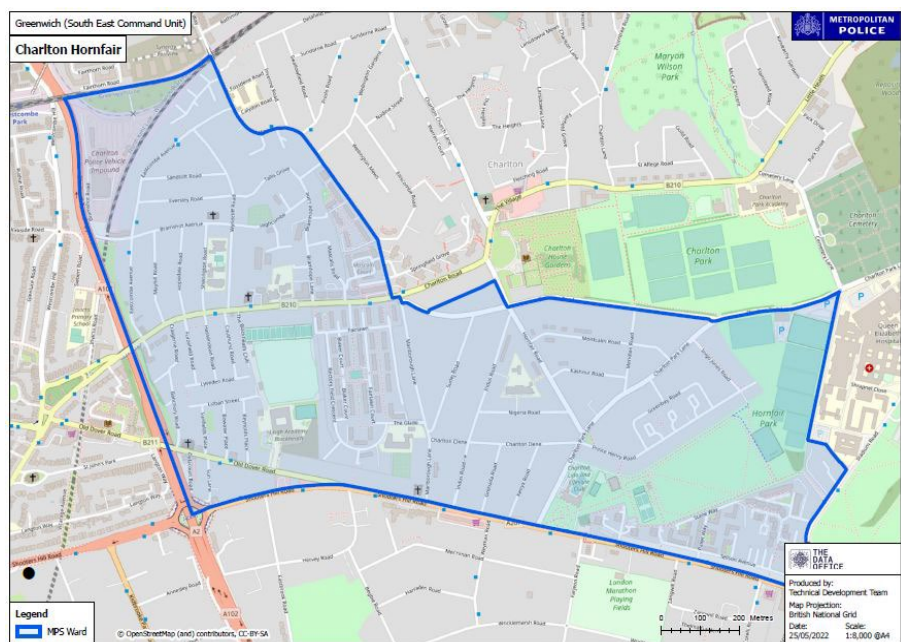


Charlton Hornfair Safer Neighbourhood Team Newsletter July 2025 Greenwich Police

Charlton Hornfair - Community Safety Updates

Over the past month, in response to reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) across the ward, the Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) has continued its patrols in the following areas:

Police Activity

Officers continue to support members of the public and local businesses through reassurance visits and targeted patrols, with a particular focus on vehicle theft, shoplifting, burglaries, hate crimes, and general ASB incidents.

Ward panel meeting

On 16 July, SNT officers attended the Charlton Hornfair Ward Panel Meeting at Charlton Lido. We presented the latest three-month crime statistics and discussed our current priorities along with actions to improve community safety.

New priorities for the coming quarter include:

- Violence-Related Priority** - Targeting Violence within the Cherry Orchard Estate.

Actions: Hi-Visibility and plain clothes patrols in targeted areas, stop and search to locate wanted offenders and close collaboration with Charlton Triangle Homes to identify causes of ASB and violence.

- Addressing ASB and Drug- Related Issues** - ASB and drugs use/dealing within Shooter Hill Estate, including Hornfair Park.

Actions: High visibility and plain-clothes patrols in targeted areas, Stop-and-search where grounds exist and ongoing intelligence monitoring.

- Drug use in Green Bay Road Area** – Tackling drug use linked to ASB and other crime offences.

Actions: Targeted patrols, monitoring and assessing intelligence, and reducing drug -related ASB in the area.

Drop in Surgery

On 11th July, a police drop-in surgery was held for the Charlton Hornfair ward at Charlton Road SE77ED, outside Nisa Local. This session gave residents the opportunity to meet their local SNT officers and discuss any concerns.

Summer Event

On Saturday 12 July, the SNT attended the “**Young Greenwich day Festival Hornfair Park**” at Hornfair Park. The event featured live music, food and craft stalls, free children's activities, and community information stands focusing on health, wellbeing, and safety. It was a fantastic opportunity for residents to enjoy the park, connect with community groups and speak to officers about ASB concerns, reporting incidents, and crime prevention.

Live Facial Recognition (LFR) Operations

Our SNT has been involved in several Live Facial Recognition Operations. This technology helps identify individuals wanted by police or the courts. For each operation, a “watchlist” is created based on intelligence. Cameras scan passing faces, and any potential matches are flagged for officers to review. Faces not on the watchlist are pixelated, and their data is immediately deleted unless there is a policing need. Watchlists are deleted after every deployment.

MET ENGAGE- Our new engagement platform

The new MET ENGAGE platform allows residents to connect with local officers, shape policing priorities, and receive tailored safety advice. It`s a two-way tool – you can share your main concerns while staying updated on our work in your area.

We continue to support other agencies with mental health assessments and assist residents in situations involving breaches of the peace.

Investigations are ongoing at several locations regarding warrants for various offences, with continuous liaison with partner agencies.

Working alongside other wards, we have also assisted with traffic operations at the periphery of our area, targeting individuals travelling into our area to commit offences.
