East Sheen

East Sheen officers were delighted to attend the Sheen Christmas event on 21.11.25, bringing along a marked police car for everyone to see. It was a fantastic opportunity to meet local residents, answer questions, and share in the festive spirit. The children especially enjoyed trying on different police hats and taking photos, a great way to learn more about policing in a fun and friendly setting.

We also visited Kids Inc Nursery on 20.11.2025, where officers spoke with children about important street safety topics, including how to cross roads safely and being aware of their surroundings. These early conversations help build confidence and encourage safe habits from a young age.











North Richmond

North Richmond officers recently investigated reports of antisocial behaviour involving graffiti on Sheendale Road. After identifying the issue, they worked closely with Richmond Council to find a lasting solution. Through this partnership, CCTV cameras were installed in the area to deter further incidents and improve community safety. Since the cameras were fitted, there have been no further reports of graffiti or related anti-social behaviour, demonstrating how collaborative efforts can make a real difference in keeping our neighbourhoods safe and welcoming.

Two males were observed by officers attempting to try multiple door handles in the area, which raised immediate concerns about potential criminal activity; they were promptly stopped and subjected to a lawful stop and search procedure, during which they were found to be in possession of cannabis, and as a result, both individuals were dealt with appropriately in accordance with police powers and current legislation to ensure community safety and prevent further offences

Kew

On 25 November 2025, officers conducted two linked stop-and-searches on KEW Green after stopping a vehicle containing two suspects, with both searches carried out under suspicion of drug possession.

Following reports of an alleged vehicle–pedestrian incident, officers conducted reassurance patrols and enforced traffic measures outside The King's Church of England School on Cumberland Road to promote road safety and provide visible community reassurance.

In a separate case, a male was arrested for harassment and breach of a restraining order, with cannabis found at his home, resulting in charges for both offences.





Richmond Safer Neighbourhood Teams, supported by MPS specialist resources, carried out a live facial recognition deployment in Richmond town centre to identify individuals wanted for serious offences and enhance public safety. Officers were present throughout to answer questions and ensure transparency. The operation was lawful, targeted, and focused on crime prevention. We thank residents and visitors for their cooperation.

Outcome: Four arrests – three for outstanding offences and failing to appear at court, and one for assault at Richmond train station during the operation.
