

LOCK, CHAIN AND COVER YOUR SCOOTER TO MAKE IT LESS VISIBLE TO THIEVES

Adding extra security makes it harder for them to steal







Over 14,000 motorcycles, scooters and mopeds were stolen in London in the last year.



- 1. LOCK it by using disc locks to secure the front brake disc and stop it from being wheeled away.
- 2. LOCK it by using grip locks on the handlebars and always engage your steering lock.
- 3. CHAIN your back wheel to street furniture and with the chain off the ground. If not, thread the chain through the frame and back wheel to protect parts being stolen. I hieves can easily use a hammer or angle grinder it a lock is on the ground.
- **4. COVER** your bike and make it less attractive to thieves as they often look to steal specific models.
