Crime data for January 2026 shows that Violence Against the Person was the most frequently recorded offence in Highfield, with 13 incidents. This was followed by Vehicle Offences (11) and Burglary (10), indicating that both personal safety and property-related crime remain key concerns.

Other recorded offences included Arson and Criminal Damage (7) and Non-Crime incidents (5). Lower levels of activity were reported for Public Order Offences, Theft, and Drug Offences, each with 2 incidents, while Robbery, Miscellaneous Crimes Against Society, and Non-Notifiable incidents recorded 1 incident each.

Overall, the data highlights areas where continued community awareness and preventative measures may be beneficial.



How you can help

Residents can play an important role in keeping Highfield safe:

Report suspicious behaviour as soon as possible, either **online** or by calling **101** or **999** in an emergency

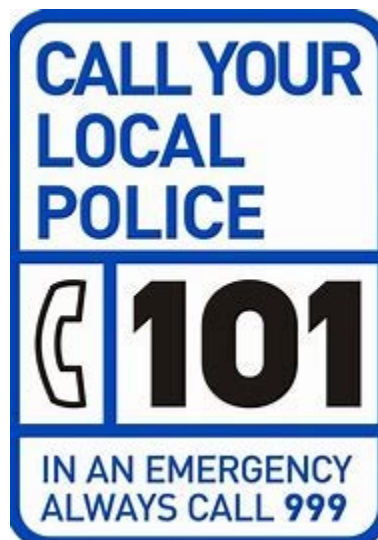
Secure vehicles by locking doors, removing valuables, and using alarms or steering wheel locks

Protect your home by locking doors and windows and using security lighting where possible

Look out for neighbours, particularly vulnerable residents

Share concerns with your local policing team or neighbourhood watch group

Burglary/Attempted burglary

Burglary non-residential:

Mintern Close – On 6th January victim has visited their rented garage to find that the padlock to their garage has been changed, and items stolen from within the garage.

New Park Avenue – pedal bike had been stolen from garage on 13th January.

Burglary Residential:

Chimes Avenue - On 7th January an untidy search of the property had been conducted by unknown suspects. Access gained via front door.

Ulster Gardens – On 14th January unknown suspects, entered the property via front UPVC door. Inner wooden door forced causing damage to lock. Cash had been stolen.

New Park Avenue – On 17th January unknown suspects broke into premises and stole jewellery.

Carpenter Gardens – On 23rd January unknown suspects entered the rear garden. The bathroom window had been forcibly opened and left in an open position, is believed to be a point of entry and exit.

Hedge Lane – On 29th January occupied residential premises had been burgled, elderly female disturbed in progress and suspects left. Rear door panel completely removed using tools.

Attempted Burglary:

Carpenter Gardens – On 22nd January two males approached the victim's home address. They throw several rocks at the windows causing them to smash. The victim immediately called police.

Connaught Gardens – possible attempted burglary on 30th January. It appears someone has tried to force entry to the front door. Tool marks are found on the frame of the front door near to the lock.

Chimes Avenue - On 17th January at approximately 1950h two males approached the front door of house and attempted to break in by kicking the front door causing damage.

Vehicle Offences:

Theft from motor vehicle:

Hedge Lane – On 3rd January between 21:12 and 23:10 unknown suspect has smashed front passenger window, taken camera and charger.

Walden Avenue – On 21st January both front and rear registration plates have been stolen from vehicle.

Farndale Avenue – On 24th January the victim's guitar had been stolen from boot.

Rayleigh Road – On 25th January both registration plates have been stolen from vehicle.

New Park Avenue – On 31st January victim's wallet was stolen from his car parked outside venue. No damage to the car.

Theft of motor vehicle:

Pembroke Road – On 3rd January white Toyota Estima had been stolen from the location.

Hedge Lane – On 3rd January white Toyota Estima was stolen. Vehicle was parked, locked and secured at the location and then camera caught it unlocked and driven off.

Coniscliffe Road – On 5th January victim reported his work van had been stolen. Recovered.

Chimes Avenue – On 25th January grey Ford had been stolen for the second time. Recovered.

New Park Avenue – On 29th January vehicle was stolen from driveway. Recovered.

Firs Lane – Reported 2nd of February: over the course of 3 days, victim's vehicle (Mitsubishi Outlander) was stolen from near home address.



Theft:

Firs Lane – On 7th January informant stated to Police that he ordered £280 worth of goods from an online retailer that was delivered by Royal Mail. He stated that he was not home at the time of delivery but received an e-mail confirmation with photographic confirmation of the item outside of his door. When he returned home, the parcel was gone.

The Larches – attempted theft on 12 January. Suspect has attended the location and tried to steal keys from victim. The suspect is known, and this sort of thing has happened before.

Criminal damage:

Hedge Lane – On 9th January victim reported that her car was kicked by a known suspect, causing two dents.

Munster Gardens – On 12 January informant called police to report a male who keeps breaking into property and has no permission to stay at this address.

Firs Lane - Criminal Damage to ANPR camera U94504 and associated equipment installed for ULEZ 2023 reported. Incident happened on 10th January.

North Circular Road – On 14th January the driver reported that his offside wing view mirror was damaged by another driver after a beloved road rage incident.

Laburnum Grove – On 16th January Range Rover had been reported being damaged. On police attendance, all the windows and windscreens had been smashed up by unknown suspects.

Crawford Gardens – On 17th January suspect has banged on glass door of betting shop in a reckless fashion, causing the panel to smash.

Munster Gardens – On 25th January suspects have put knife through wall to victims' room.

Barrow Close - On 26th January damage to a window was reported.

Robbery:

Underpass of the Great Cabridge Roundabout - Victim was put in fear of immediate violence by the suspect as he thought he had a blade on him, and he may harm him.

Metropolitan Police warrant cards and passes are changing

If you have any contact with police officers or staff from the Metropolitan Police Service their identity document will look different. There is nothing you need to do, other than familiarise yourself with the new document.
